We are committed to increasing the number of students who graduate from high school inspired for and prepared to have success in college and life. Our education grants are directed to our local neighborhoods with the greatest need.

We have a special interest in funding Education grant proposals that are rooted in evidenced-based research and target critical leverage points along the K- 12 education pathway, focusing on the following:

- Alignment with district priorities
- Key inflection points, such as:
 - Kindergarten readiness
 - Reading at grade level by grade 3 and bolstering writing skills
 - Engaging students in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Math) learning
 - Mastering Algebra I by 9th grade
 - Increasing graduation rates and establishing a post-secondary pathway
- Championing teachers and their development

Arts and Culture

Creativity sparks the imagination and drives the development of new ideas that can transform the way we live. We support efforts that bring the full spectrum of artistic expression to the greater community, from visual and performing arts to community events and workshops.

We have a special interest in funding Arts and Culture grant proposals that:

- Provide shared experiences and have broad community appeal
- Ensure access to young people of diverse backgrounds, particularly in underserved neighborhoods
- Bring arts to classrooms to expand learning

Environment

To engage employees and community members in working toward a more sustainable future, we invest in environmental education and community-based projects that demonstrate the importance and value of protecting the environment.

We have a special interest in funding Environment grant proposals that:

- Focus on environmental education for young people, especially in underserved communities
- Promote environmental stewardship and provide hands-on learning experiences
- Encourage hands-on volunteer opportunities for employees and their families as well as the community at-large
